New Quarterly Mission Focus: Frontline Foundations, Inc.

A new quarter is here and with that, we are shifting our focus to a new quarterly mission: Frontline Foundations. Their goal is to serve as a source of hope to young men and women suffering from drug and alcohol abuse while also providing an effective treatment and recovery support system.

With their unique approach, Frontline places a strong emphasis on young adults between the ages of 18-38. They support through recovery workshops, peer-to-peer group sessions and individual treatment plans that professional substance abuse counselors and program coordinators facilitate.

Why Frontline? The statistics issued by Indiana Strategic Prevention Framework state that the highest rate of cocaine and marijuana use is among 18-25 year olds, including the highest rate of heavy drinking and binge drinking and the highest rate of prescription drug abuse.

Would you like to make a difference in someone's life? The second most commonly cited reason for people not receiving substance abuse treatment is being unable to afford the perceived costs. Your contribution will support scholarships for those seeking treatment who are otherwise unable to afford services. Your quarterly mission giving helps provide this important resource to those in need.
