The Duneland Medical Equipment Loan Closet, located in the Duneland Resale Shop at 801 Broadway, will be closed for the holidays through Saturday, January 12th. The closet will reopen on Tuesday, January 15th at 1 p.m. During this time, they will be unable to check out medical equipment and

they ask that no donations be dropped off. They are sorry for the inconvenience, but if you truly have an emergency need of equipment, please call Porter United Methodist Church at (219) 926-1586.

As a reminder, the Duneland Medical Loan Closet is a wonderful community resource for persons living in Pine, Liberty, Jackson and Westchester Townships. They offer FREE LOANS of medical equipment (wheelchairs, walkers, commodes, crutches, canes, etc.) for 3 MONTHS. The closet has also added knee walkers into their inventory for a 1-month

loan period and a \$20 refundable deposit. Hours for the closet are Tuesdays from 1 - 3:45 p.m. and Saturdays from 9:30 - 11:45a.m. The loan closet is always looking for those who are interested in volunteering so the closet might be able to increase the number of hours they can serve the community. No experience is necessary as training will be provided.
