As approximately 1,800 clergy and laity come together to remember Ephesians 4:5, "one Lord, one faith, one baptism". What an inspiring sound, hearing during worship many voices being lifted up in one song, for example, He's Got the Whole World in His Hands. Are you singing it too? 

The 2019 Indiana Annual Conference Summary

A total of 1,743 people attended the 2019 Indiana Annual Conference held June 12th -15th in Indianapolis, with the theme, "From Water to Witness," with Ephesians 4:4-5 as the primary text for the week: "There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to one hope when you were called; one Lord, one faith, one baptism." (NIV)

The Annual Conference kicked off with a Praise and Celebration service led by Greg Krempel, Director of Worship Arts at Covenant UMC, Fort Wayne. The keynote speaker for the evening was Pastor Rudy Rasmus from St. John's UMC in Houston, Texas, who blessed the Conference with his keynote address "Just Cross the Doggone Street!" based on the parable of the Good Samaritan.

During the opening worship an offering totaling \$7,671.40 was received that will be used for organizations and ministries fighting the opioid crisis in Indiana, including *A Better Life – Brianna's Hope* (ABL-BH) and *Lucille Raines Residence*. Members of the Annual Conference also donated 1,100 blankets that are given to ABL-BH participants at their first meeting as a powerful reminder that God and the community are always available for them. To close the day Wednesday, Bishop Julius C. Trimble led the Conference in Holy Communion.

Thursday morning began with a Retiree Celebration where retirees and spouses processed into the Indianapolis Convention Center to upbeat renditions of "Hail Jesus, You're My King" and "Endless Praise" as they greeted Bishop Julius C. Trimble and First Lady Racelder Grandberry-Trimble. They carried vessels of water they poured into a central baptismal, which would be used during the Celebration of Ministry service. A total of 69 retirees were honored for their nearly 900 years of service to the Indiana Conference of The United Methodist Church.

The Council on Finance and Administration illustrated what happens when we give using the visual of 100 pennies. Of the 100 pennies, 88 of those pennies go back to our local churches. The remaining 12 pennies break down to support the remaining efforts of our church: 2¢ supports ministry within our 10 districts, 4¢ supports the work of our General Church, what is often referred to as Apportionments and the final 6¢ supports our Annual Conference core ministries and administrative oversight.

Cathy Burris, President of United Methodist Women of Indiana, reported that the organization is celebrating 150 years in mission. A video was shared about their history and impact over the years.

The Trustees reported that in 2018 10 churches closed or abandoned church properties with \$361,350 disbursed from sales going toward new District & Ministry initiatives and for local church ministries.

Thursday evening concluded with a Celebration of Ministry Service led by Bishop Trimble. During the service, 4 children were baptized, 9 persons were commissioned into ministry, 13 persons were ordained into the Order of Elder, and 3 persons were ordained into the Order of Deacon. In his sermon "Go, Wash in the Pool of Siloam," Bishop Trimble encouraged those being commissioned and ordained that they would "do well to take the example of Leslie Bledsoe to wake up every morning and say, 'What is my assignment today?' She doesn't tell God about the size of her mountain. She speaks to her mountain about the size of her God." During the recessional, those ordained dipped cups into the baptismal font and carried out water that was placed there earlier in the day by retirees.

During the Friday session, Bishop Trimble began his address "From Water to Witness – I Dare You to Believe" with a video portraying the value of every person. "There's nothing you can do—or anyone else can do—to change your sacred worth in Jesus Christ. That has always been settled!" he said. Bishop prompted the Conference to read Acts 8:26-40 in unison. He followed up with, "If you preach or worship in a small town, the Bible says we need to proclaim the Gospel in every little town…big town…all towns!"

The evening was highlighted by the Celebration of Life Service, led by Rev. Karen Koelsch, Senior Pastor of Covenant UMC, Fort Wayne, who shared her message, "*The Jesus Road*." She shared how, when lost on the backroads of Indiana, she would look for water towers to help her find her way. "Who do you remember that have been water towers for you? Who have been the people that pointed you to Christ, especially in those moments when you've been lost?"

Loved ones stood as the names of 56 deceased clergy and spouses were read and honored for their lives and legacies. Bishop Trimble led members in the partaking of Holy Communion. The bread and cup sat on a white cloth that family and friends signed with words of remembrance. It served as a reminder that we are connected forever to loved ones, though they may have passed on to heaven. "As you receive the body and blood of Christ, be reminded that those who have gone before us cheer us on and are interceding on our behalf," Bishop Trimble said.

It was decided that the 2020 Indiana Annual Conference will be held June 11th-13th, at Indiana Wesleyan University in Marion, Indiana.



Create this colorful July 4th craft.

What you need:

- Decorated card stock square (5"x 5")
- Scissors
- Hole punch
- 2 one-inch circles of card stock
- Glue
- Pipe cleaner (3 inches
- Drinking straw


What you do:

- 1. Fold the square corner to corner to form an X. Unfold.
- 2. To make spokes, cut the four creases until an inch from the center.
- 3. Punch a hole in the middle of the square, near the tips of each spoke, and in the middle of each circle.
- 4. Fold each spoke toward the center, lining up the holes. Glue in place.
- 5. Wrap one end of the pipe cleaner around the top of the straw. Thread a circle, the pinwheel, and the remaining circle onto the pipe cleaner.
- 6. Roll the pipe cleaner end into a ball. Then spin!

Play this memory game to start each day in God's Word.





What you need:
